
JIM McFAULL and BANYAN GOLD

From 1990 until his death in 2012, he served as a director or officer with either the Yukon Chamber of Mines or the Yukon Prospectors Association.

The claims staked by McFaull covered a gold in soil anomaly underling Aurex Hill, an area where the Aurex Hill Deposit was delinated by Banyan in 2022.
